DESK-BASED THEMATIC REVIEWS

The Commission has developed three desk-based, industry-wide thematic reviews to obtain business operations information from all SIA/IFA/FSCPA registrants and licensees. The first two surveys, competed in July 2020, focused on anti-money laundering and countering the financing of terrorism procedures and practices (AML/CFT/PF), and business continuity plans. The Commission will publish the results upon completion of its analysis. The results informed the Commission's 2021 Priorities. The third desk-based thematic review on the suitability of complex financial products is pending release.
