## Re: International Obligations (Economic and Ancillary Measures) Act, Chapter 16 (IOEAMA): Mali

Pursuant to section 3A of the International Obligations (Economic and Ancillary Measures) Act, Chapter 16 (IOEAMA), licensees and registrants of the Securities Commission of The Bahamas (the Commission) are hereby informed that on 30 August 2022, the United Nations Security Council adopted Resolution 2649 (2022) extending the travel ban and asset freeze imposed through Resolution 2374 (2017) against individuals and entities obstructing implementation of the 2015 Agreement on Peace and Reconciliation in Mali until 31 August 2023.

## Security Council Renews Mali Sanctions, Panel of Experts Monitoring Implementation, Unanimously Adopting Resolution 2649 (2022)

The Security Council today renewed until 31 August 2023 the travel ban and asset freeze imposed through resolution 2374 (2017) against individuals and entities obstructing implementation of the 2015 Agreement on Peace and Reconciliation in Mali.

Unanimously adopting resolution 2649 (2022), (to be issued as document <u>S/RES/2649</u>) under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, the 15-member organ also extended until 30 September 2023 the mandate of the Panel of Experts, as set out in paragraphs 11 to 15 of resolution 2374 (2017), as well as the request — contained therein — encouraging the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (MINUSMA) to assist the Panel.

By other terms, the Council welcomed the designation by Mali of a focal point responsible for communication with the Committee established pursuant to resolution 2374 (2017) and called for the "swift and timely" exchange of information.

The Council requested the Secretary-General to take the necessary administrative measures as expeditiously as possible to reestablish the Panel of Experts, in consultation with the Committee established pursuant to resolution 2374 (2017), drawing on the expertise of its current members.

Against that backdrop, the Council requested the Panel to provide a midterm report no later than 28 February 2023, a final report no later than 15 August 2023 and periodic updates in between.

The meeting began at 3:05 p.m. and ended at 3:07 p.m.
